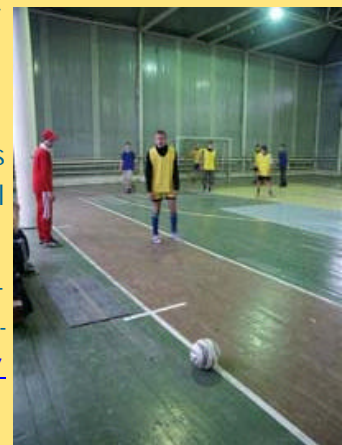
## Health
